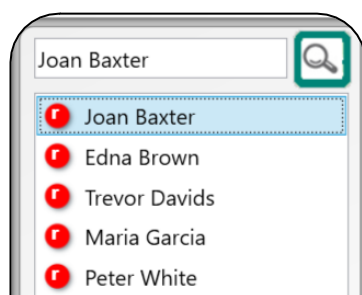


Meds Round – Warfarin



Click on the Meds Round icon.



Select the appropriate **resident**.



Select the Warfarin. If Warfarin is not to be administered that round, then it will be greyed out and will say “NOT FOR ROUND”.



This is the warfarin administration window. It is like the normal medication administration window except for the list of different strengths of Warfarin that can be used. It gives a recommended combination of strengths to make up the expected dosage, however this is only a recommendation and any combination is permitted.
